

Declaration on EU Directives RoHS, REACH and WEEE

Ladies and gentlemen,

we hereby confirm that the articles produced by Hepako GmbH conform to the following EU Directives. In addition, our products are 100 % free of asbestos.

EU Directive 2011/65/EU, formerly 2002/95/EG (RoHS)

Directive on Restriction of Hazardous Substances regarding the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical or electronic equipment - RoHS Directive.

The directive, which entered into force on 21 July 2011, stipulates that the use of lead, mercury, cadmium, hexavalent chromium, polybrominated biphenyls (PBB) and polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE) is prohibited if it exceeds the limit of 0.1 % (0.01 % for cadmium).

EU regulation 1907/2006/EG (REACH)

Regulation (EG) no. 1907/2006 of the European Parliament and the European Council from 18 December 2006 regarding the Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH), the creation of a European Agency, the amendment of regulation (EG) no. 1999/45/EG and the repealing of regulation (EWG) no. 793/93 of the European Council, regulation (EG) no. 1488/94 of the European Commission, Directive 76/769/EWG of the European Council, as well as Directives 91/155/EWG, 93/67/EWG, 93/105/EG and 2000/21/EG of the European Commission.

The Directive, which entered into force on 1 June 2007, was enacted in order to streamline and improve the legal framework for chemical substances in the European Union (EU).

EU Directive 2002/96/EG (WEEE)

Directive 2002/96/EG of the European Parliament and the European Council from 27 January 2003 regarding waste electrical and electronic equipment.

As we are not a distributor of electrical or electronic equipment, we are not subject to this Directive.
